RENEWAL OF THE GAS TAX PROGRAM AND QUEBEC'S CONTRIBUTION (2024 TO 2028) – NEGOTIATIONS BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENTS OF QUEBEC AND CANADA

WHEREAS the governments of Quebec and Canada are currently conducting negotiations for the renewal of the Gas Tax Program and Quebec's contribution (TECQ) for the period 2024 – 2028;

WHEREAS on August 24, 2023, the Board of Directors of the Fédération québécoise des municipalités (FQM) asked the governments of Quebec and Canada to reach a rapid agreement to ensure the renewal of this important program;

WHEREAS this program is essential to the realization of important projects in Quebec communities;

WHEREAS despite the large sums allocated to this programme, they remain insufficient to meet the needs and that they must be increased because of the increase in project implementation costs;

WHEREAS the Federation of Canadian Municipalities has asked the federal government to double its investments in this program and to provide for an indexation of 3.5% per year;

WHEREAS the FQM and its members have been asking for several years that the Gas Tax and Quebec Contribution Program (TECQ) allow the financing and implementation of projects planned and decided by Quebec municipalities, in the sense that municipal building projects (garages, city halls, fire stations, etc.) and work on containment structures (dams,, etc.) are eligible for this program;

WHEREAS the importance of adapting programmes to the challenges posed by climate change and of enabling municipalities to finance the implementation of

developments and adaptation works to the consequences of these changes, such as the construction of fire belts to protect forest communities;

WHEREAS accountability for projects is cumbersome for municipalities;

WHEREAS negotiations must be concluded in early autumn 2023 to ensure its implementation on 1 January 2024 and to allow municipalities to plan investments in their budgets;

WHEREAS the sums granted to this program must be exempt from any new obligation or condition to ensure its success;

IT IS PROPOSED BY Craig Gabie, **SECONDED BY** Paul Chamberlain **AND UNANIMOUSLY RESOLVED**, that the municipality of Kazabazua request that the governments of Quebec and Canada to:

- Conclude in early fall a new federal-provincial agreement for the renewal of the Gas Tax and Quebec Contribution Program (TECQ) for the period from January 1, 2024 to December 31, 2028;
- Increase the amounts available to Quebec municipalities and provide for an annual increase in the envelope for the duration of the agreement to cover increased costs;
- Not to add any additional accountability, obligation or condition to municipalities in the application of the program;
- Enable the financing of municipal building projects, retention works and wharves owned by municipalities in eligible work;
- Make eligible projects to prevent, develop and adapt to the consequences of climate change.

To transmit a copy of this resolution to the Minister of Finance of Quebec, Mr. Éric Girard, to the Minister of Municipal Affairs of Quebec, Ms. Andrée Laforest, to the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Finance of Canada, the Honourable Chrystia Freeland, to the Minister of Housing, Infrastructure and Communities of Canada, the Honourable Sean Fraser, to the Minister of Transport and Lieutenant of Quebec, The Honourable Pablo Rodriguez, Member of Parliament Robert Bussière, the Fédération québécoise des municipalités and the Fédération canadienne des municipalités.

HEAVY VEHICLE TRAFFIC ON THE GREEN BRIDGE

WHEREAS the width of the roadway on the Green Bridge at the entrance to the municipality of Lac Sainte- Marie is less than that on the surrounding areas;

WHEREAS the speed limit for the Green Bridge sector should be a maximum of 50km/h;

WHEREAS the municipality of Lac Sainte-Marie has received a complaint saying that two heavy transports that meet in the middle of the bridge, even at the speed of 50km/h, is very risky and above all is very trying for drivers of heavy vehicles;

WHEREAS this initiative stems from a recent event experienced by a driver of Maniwaki HLH Oils who had engaged on the bridge and was at the middle, in the opposite direction, another heavy vehicle entered the bridge without reducing its speed;

WHEREAS we must not wait for a disaster to occur on this bridge before acting;

WHEREAS in recent years we have had a lot of heavy vehicles that use this bridge every day for their economic activities in both municipalities

WHEREAS it would be safer for heavy vehicles to post "Narrow Passage / D-200" signs and below to install "One Heavy Vehicle at a Time / P-200-P-1" signs.

THEREFORE, it is proposed by Damien Lafrenière, seconded by Sylvain La France and it is resolved;

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THAT the Municipality of Kazabazua support the request of the Municipality of Lac Sainte-Marie to ask the Ministry of Transport to install appropriate signs around the bridge for the safety of truck drivers.

REQUEST FOR SUPPORT - BAN ON FLOATING HOMES OR THEIR USE -REQUEST TO PROVINCIAL AND FEDERAL GOVERNMENTS

WHEREAS a new type of floating craft - structures used primarily as living quarters, commonly referred to as "floating homes" or "floating dwellings" - seems to be gaining ground;

WHEREAS this type of craft makes it possible to occupy a navigable body of water on a longer-term basis, using it as floating accommodation without paying taxes or royalties for the use of the space occupied;

WHEREAS the possibility of installing floating accommodations raises concerns about navigational safety, respect for neighbors, i.e. waterfront properties, and respect for the environment;

WHEREAS this use may have potentially negative effects on the environment, notably by disturbing local fish and wildlife, disrupting the natural environment and increasing the risk of pollution from garbage, grey water disposal and spills;

WHEREAS the majority of municipalities do not have the necessary facilities to accommodate this type of watercraft, including wastewater treatment facilities;

IT IS PROPOSED by Damien Lafrenière, SECONDED by Sylvain La France And resolved;

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TO ASK the federal and provincial governments to prohibit access to bodies of water to structures used primarily as dwellings, commonly called "floating homes" or "floating dwellings", or to provide a regulatory framework to prohibit the use of floating dwellings on bodies of water in Quebec;

TO ASK for the support of the municipalities and the MRC de la Vallée-de-la-Gatineau, the Fédération Québécoise des municipalités (FQM) and the Union des municipalités du Québec (UMQ) in this request;

AND

THAT this resolution be sent to Sophie Chatel, Member of Parliament for Pontiac, to Robert Bussière, MNA for Gatineau, to the Minister of Natural Resources and Forestry, to the Minister of the Environment, Climate Change, Wildlife and Parks, and to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing.

CPTAQ – SUPPORT FOR AN EXCLUSION REQUEST

WHEREAS the Municipality of Kazabazua has presented a request for alienation to the Commission de protection du territoire agricole du Québec bearing file number 439170;

WHEREAS the Commission proceeded with the administrative closure of the file on the grounds that, in accordance with the first paragraph of section 61.2 of the Act respecting the protection of agricultural land and agricultural activities1 (the Act), request for authorization 439170 should be considered as a request for exclusion because it concerns a new use for institutional purposes on a lot contiguous to the limits of the agricultural zone of the Municipality of Kazabazua, namely lot 5 497 608 with a surface area of 6732.1 square metres;

WHEREAS the Council has taken note of the application to be submitted to the Commission de protection du territoire agricole du Québec by the Municipality of Kazabazua to obtain from that Commission an authorization to exclude the agricultural zone from lot 5 497 608 of the official cadastre of Québec, in the Municipality of Kazabazua, totalling an area of 6,732.1 square metres;

WHEREAS section 58 of the Act respecting the preservation of agricultural land and agricultural activities provides that a person who wishes to do an act for which an authorization or a permit is required in respect of a lot located in an agricultural zone must apply to the local municipality in whose territory lot 5 497 608 is situated;

WHEREAS there is no other suitable space available elsewhere in the territory of the Municipality of Kazabazua and outside the agricultural zone that can satisfy the demand, as required by section 58.2 of the Act;

WHEREAS this application complies with the zoning by-law of the Municipality;

WHEREAS the impact of the authorization sought on the agricultural development of the sector is negligible, considering the analysis criteria subject to section 62 of the Act respecting the preservation of agricultural land and agricultural activities, P-41.1.;

WHEREAS the authorization sought has no negative impact on the protection and development of agricultural activities;

WHEREAS the application fully meets the criteria of section 62 of the Act respecting the preservation of agricultural land and agricultural activities, namely;

• The agricultural potential of the lot and surrounding lots:

Based on data from the Canada Land Inventory maps, the dominant agricultural potential of the soils of the lot and area is Class 7 with limitation 1, i.e. solid rock from topography and moisture constraints.

• The possibilities of using the lot for agricultural purposes: The presence of Class 7 soils and solid rock on lot 5,497,608, as well as the presence of residences in its immediate vicinity, does not allow agricultural use of the premises.

 The consequences of an authorization on existing agricultural activities and on the development of those agricultural activities and on the possibilities of agricultural use of neighbouring lots, in particular taking into account the standards intended to mitigate the inconveniences related to odours inherent in agricultural activities resulting from the exercise of the powers provided for in subparagraph 4e of the second paragraph of section 113 of the Act respecting land use planning and development (chapter a- 19.1):

To our knowledge, no agricultural activity is carried on on the lot concerned, nor on the surrounding lots.

 The constraints and effects resulting from the application of laws and regulations, particularly in environmental matters and more particularly for livestock production establishments:

There are no constraints or negative effects resulting from the application of environmental laws and regulations and more particularly for animal production establishments, considering that no such regulation has been adopted by the Municipality of Kazabazua.

 The availability of alternative locations to eliminate or reduce constraints on agriculture, particularly when the application relates to a lot included in a census agglomeration or census metropolitan area as defined by Statistics Canada or to a lot included in the territory of a community:

There is no other location likely to eliminate or reduce the constraints on agriculture, considering that the authorization sought does not create any negative constraint on agriculture and that this is the only lot on the municipal territory including a natural descent for boats.

• The homogeneity of the community and the farm:

This will be maintained.

• The effect on the preservation of water and soil resources for agriculture on the territory of the local municipality and in the region:

No effect.

• The establishment of land holdings of sufficient size to cultivate according to a variety of viable agricultural models and projects that may require various areas:

No severance or subdivision operations are planned.

 The effect on the economic development of the region on evidence submitted by a municipality, community, public body or organization providing public utilities:

The authorization sought will contribute considerably to the development of our

region by improving the offer of tourism products.

The socio-economic conditions necessary for the viability of a community when the low density of land use justifies it:

Our MRC is one of the most devitalized in the province of Quebec. The realization of this project can only help us to improve our position.

IT IS THEREFORE PROPOSED by Sylvain La France, **SECONDED** by Craig Gabie and resolved;

TO recommend to the Commission de protection du territoire agricole du Québec to accept this application for authorization for the exclusion of lot 5 497 608 official cadastre of Quebec, in the Municipality of Kazabazua.
