

	WHEREAS	the village of LOW is located in the mid-Gatineau region and would be a prime location for such a Health Clinic;	
	WHEREAS	the Municipality of LOW already has the basic infrastructures in place to receive such a Health Clinic;	
	WHEREAS	such a Health Clinic would serve the overall area including the lower part of the MRCVG including the Municipality of LOW but also the isolated Municipality of Denholm as well as a good part of the municipalities of Val des Bois and Val des Monts and its Francophone and Anglophone speaking populations;	

WHEREAS such a centrally-located Health Clinic would greatly reduce the

volume of persons having to utilize the Gatineau Memorial Hospital Emergency Department in order to consult a doctor;

WHEREAS such an alleviation of the clientele at the Gatineau Memorial

Hospital Emergency Department would reduce the operating cost of this service which will no doubt have to be expanded if any of the surrounding CLSC operations are curtailed in any

way;

WHEREAS the lack of availability of family doctors and doctor services at the

LOW CLSC is already incurring the high volume of Emergency

room visits in the area;

WHEREAS this region is already recognized as a devitalized and

economically-deprived area;

WHEREAS it is the Government's stated intention and mandate to reduce
